



The singer Walter "El Chino" Laborde was born in 1972 in Avellaneda, a suburb of Buenos Aires. He is the front man of the Tango Orchesta Típica Fernandez Fierro and surely the tango singer with the biggest rock attitude of the tango scene. He is a leading figure among the talented young musicians breaking the borders of traditional Argentinan music, always with great respect and love for its deep roots. As a singer of Fernandez Fierro and traditional Tango Orchestras like Sans Souci and Sexteto Mayor and his Duo "Tango Tango" with the guitarist Diego "Dipi" Kvitko he toured Japan and several countries in Europe and the Americas. Furthermore he was an actor in several theatre plays like "El romance del Romeo y La Julieta", "Discepolin y Yo" and "Minga, Tango y Circo" and in feature films like "Luna de Avellaneda" directed by J. Jose Campanella. Currently he hosts a film week and a Tango documentary in the Argentinean public television.
